Timeline (2007-2014)





October 30th, 2007

FIFA officially announces Brazil as the 2014 FIFA World Cup host nation

May 31st, 2009

São Paulo is announced as one of the 12 host cities of the event

May 30th, 2011

Corinthians and Odebrecht begin the works at Arena Corinthians







Timeline (2007-2014)

October 20th, 2011

FIFA announces São Paulo as host of the opening ceremony

September 12th, 2012

DERSA begins the works of the Itaquera Road Complex

April 15th, 2014 Odebrecht delivers th

Odebrecht delivers the construction of the Arena Corinthians

April 28th, 2014

State and City Government start to deliver the Road Complex









Numbers and forecasts for the World Cup in São Paulo

- * 1 billion household viewers in the opening match
- * 5,200 thousand accredited journalists
- * 15 national teams in SP
- * 391 thousand tickets
- * 258 thousand foreign tourists
- * 1,18 million Brazilian tourists









Arena Corinthians

The stadium will host 6 matches.

Teams train in the Arena one day before the match.

Itaquera Road Complex

Works

Five road improvement works, a new footbridge and urban interventions in the public spaces surrounding Arena Corinthians and the Itaquera Institutional Hub.



Investiments

* State Gov.: R\$ 397,9 million

* City Hall: R\$ 150,6 million

* Total: R\$ 548,5 million

Impacts

26 expropriations and 8 removals







Infrastructure Works around the Arena

- Itaquera Overpass (240 meters long)
- New Public Plaza (17,500 sqm)
- Renovation and Expansion of Itaquera
 City Terminal (additional 18,500 sqm)
- Renewal of the Public Lighting System in the 'Radial Leste' Corridor (24 km)
- Roof installation and light points in the Corinthians-Itaquera station overpass.

Holidays

Holidays during match days in the Arena Corinthians

- * Municipal: June 12th (does not affect critical services)
- * Religious: June 19th (Corpus Christi)
- * State: July 9th

School Calendar

- * State network: holidays from June 12th to July 11th
- * Municipal network: holidays from June 12th to July 13th

Hours on match days of the Brazilian National Team

* Municipal public servants: up to three hours before the match









Mobility Plans: guidelines

TO THE FANS

- * Use public transport to go to the match
- * Buy 2 tickets (round trip) at once
- * Arrive early at the sta

TO ACCREDITATED GUESTS

- * Follow strictly the orientations in your map to access the correct parking
- * Avoid "Radial Leste" this road will be dedicated to service transportation



Mobility Plans: how to get to the stadium

Verify your ticket for the entrance side for the match

- * For **WEST ENTRANCE**, access Metro Line 3 Red and go to Artur Alvim station
- * For **EAST ENTRANCE**, access CPTM Line 11- Coral ("Expresso Copa") and got to Corinthians-Itaquera station









Mobility Plans: how to get to the stadium

"Expresso Copa" (CPTM)

- * By train, nonstop, from Luz station to Corinthians-Itaquera station, in 19 minutes
- * The operation starts three hours before the match









Mobility Plans: restrictions in match days

ÁREA DE INTERDIÇÃO VEICULAR R HARRY DAWNENBERG Área de restrição

- The access to the surroundings of the stadium will be restricted to fans with tickets, area residents and accredited vehicles
- There will be 2,850 parking spots for accredited vehicles (buses, vans and cars)
- * After visiting 130 households and commercial establishments in the restricted area, CET has issued 116 'Area Resident Access Authorizations'







Mobility Plan: "World Cup operation" (CET)

Changes to the Road System

- 6 Vehicle Checkpoints: access only to accredited vehicles
- 26 Operational Roadblocks: no access to vehicles
- 12 Local Access Points
 Streets where access is allowed
 to accredited area residents









Mobility Plan: support from 'Atende' network

What is it?

Special Attention Service (Atende), with free door-to-door transportation for people with disabilities and reduced mobility

How to use

'Atende' vehicles will stay at Itaquera City Terminal. To access the service, users must go to Corinthians-Itaquera station









Mobility Operation: how to get to the stadium



From the Guarulhos International Airport:

- To the stadium: Airport Bus Service (R\$ 36,50)
- To the Metro: EMTU Bus Service to "Metrô Tatuapé" (R\$ 4,45)

From Congonhas Airport

- To the Metro: Bus Line "Metrô São Judas" (R\$ 3)

Taxi

- There are 34 thousand taxis in São Paulo
- The airports have accredited taxi stops







Security Plans: the Command Center

CICCR (Integrated Command and Regional Control Center) is working since May, in the Luz area.

Composition:

60 public institutions (federal, state and municipal), from four different areas: transports and traffic, security, health and civil protection

Monitoring

Through 500 cameras installed in the City

Working Hours

24 hours a day









Operational Plans Security

- The 'Special Operation' will last from June 10th to July 18th
- The police command will have 4,625 officers working in 40 strategic points
- The security within the stadium will be under Stewards responsibility (in service to FIFA)



- The Surveillance and Operations
 Center will work in the stadium, under the supervision of public authority
- The Municipal Guard will support the surroundings of Arena Corinthians and the Public Views







Operational Plans Health

Main objective

To offer universal medical assistance, with quality to all visitors



Governing body

Integrated Center of Health Operations (CIOCS): risk situations, situações de risco; epidemiological and health surveillance; responses to public health emergencies.







Responsabilities during match days

- FIFA: to attend fans within Arena Corinthians, in accordance to the municipal sanitation legislation
- City and State Government: to attend the surroundings of the stadium, through SAMU (Emergency Care Transfer Service) and, in contingency cases, through GRAU (Rescue and Emergency Services)

*There will be operations in other strategic locations such as, Fan Fest, Public Views, Open Media Center, among others.









Tourism Promotion



- Launch of the "2014 São Paulo Guide" and "São Paulo Itineraries"
- Modernization of Touristic Information Centres (TIC's) and inauguration of other six new TIC's.
